JUDGE - Mrs Helena Fitzgerald (WA)

I would like to thank the Border Collie Club of NSW for the honour of Judging your 60th Championship Show, I was so pleased to see so many beautiful Border Collies of quality so well presented and handled thank you exhibitors

My apologies for the critiques being late but this is due to the sad loss of a very special friend, also there are some critiques that were not completed due to technical difficulties with the recorder (or should I say the operator of it! myself!)

My congratulations to all on a very well-run show and a beautiful trophy table

BABY PUPPY DOG CLASS (6 entries)

- 1st NAHROF WHITE COLLAR CRIME Somers/Badior <u>BEST OPPOSITE BABY PUPPY IN SHOW</u> Four month old baby, good head beautiful shape, moved nicely, beautifully angulated, good shoulders, and beautiful stifle, presented superbly. Thank you.
- 2nd DANARI DIAMOND INTH NITE P & T Wheatley
 A very solid young baby, nice head, good neck, a shade longer than the other one, would like to see more angulation on the hind quarters but used himself very well, good bone, one for the future.
- 3rd NAHROF PRINCE OF THIEVES L Somers/E Badior
 A beautiful shaped puppy a little bit over awed today, good head, nice shoulders, he was a little loose going and coming side gait when he settled was lovely.
- 4th CLANHEATH ALL ABOUT ME E Bevk
 Again another quality baby, nice head, reasonable reach of neck, shoulders not quite as good as 1st,
 2nd or 3rd, moved nice, croup a little bit steep.

MINOR PUPPY DOG CLASS (5 entries)

- 1st BENSHIVA WALK LIKE A MAN M Dean/B Farrell BEST OPPOSITE MINOR PUPPY IN SHOW Good head, good expression, lovely to see broad flat skull, nice muzzle, nice dark eyes, would like the shoulder laid back a little bit, a shade short at this stage but that's a growing stage and could change,
- 2nd TOJESS ONCE IN A BLUE MOON G & S Stephenson
 A dog that is slightly longer, nice head, would like a darker eye, would like a bit broader muzzle, reasonable shoulders, nice top line, good stifle.
- 3rd GREMARIC TORQUE THE TORQUE G & P Revell A nice type of dog, a little shorter on leg, front angulation shoulder could be laid back a bit more, would like a darker eye, short neck, top line not level but again an age and growing stage and tail set high and I would like to see more angles on the hind quarter.

PUPPY DOG CLASS (2 entries)

1st DANARI DOCTOR McDREAMY – P & T Wheatley BEST OPPOSITE PUPPY IN SHOW

Nearly twelve months old, beautiful head, would like a slightly darker eye, lovely stop, beautiful expression, good ears, nice head, good muzzle, would like the shoulders maybe placed a little bit further back, lovely length of body, nice stifle, a very nice dog.

2nd CLANHEATH TWIST OF FATE – P & J Marshall

A nice style of dog, reasonable head, would like a little more stop, shoulders could do to be laid a bit further back, nice length of body, carries his tail on the move, and the tail set slightly high otherwise a very nice dog.

JUNIOR DOG CLASS (5 entries)

I apologise for no critiques for this class but appears to be a problem with the recorder (or the person using it)

- 1st GLENTRESS EPIC VOYAGE D & K Adams BEST JUNIOR IN SHOW
- 2nd TULLAVIEW TAKE YOUR MARK (AI) C & P Smith
- 3rd BORDALACE CATCH ME IF U CAN A Cowin

INTERMEDIATE DOG CLASS (6 entries)

1st GLENTRESS DARE TO DREAM – D & K Adams BEST INTERMEDIATE IN SHOW
A beautiful chocolate dog, beautiful head, a lovely eye, good expression, lovely lay of shoulder, good top line, good bone, nice deep chest, good stifle, lovely hocks, beautiful tail set, well done, congratulations.

2nd NAHROF TURN TO THE DARK SIDE - C Butler

A slightly longer dog, not the bone of the first placed dog, a beautiful dog on the move, well balanced, not quite as good in the shoulder as the first dog,.

3rd DALHEATH MIDNIGHT SUN – M Rockey

Again a very nice dog, I would like to see a slightly darker eye and not quite as round, reach of neck good, lay of the shoulder good, and a level top line, tends to on the move lift his tail slightly which makes him look unbalanced.

4th EBONJUL KELLYVIX BAZZ CD - M Foord

Again a nice dog lacked the movement of the other three and lacked the shoulder placement, nice top line.

AUSTRALIAN BRED DOG CLASS (6 entries)

A difficult choice here between first and second, one slightly taller dog, slightly larger in bone, two very very nice dogs, probably my most difficult decision of the day, loved them both for different reasons,

1st CH SYRYNE ALTAIR O AGUILAE HSAS – S Fossey <u>BEST OPPOSITE AUST BRED IN SHOW</u> Would like a darker eye, would like the muzzle slightly shorter, nice broad skull, lovely lay of shoulder, nice top line, good length of body, good coming and going.

2nd CH NAHROF NO MORE MR ICE GUY (AI) – L Somers/E Badior

Slightly smaller than the first, beautiful on the move, tended to be a little bit close behind and didn't give me enough reach on the last run today, would like an eye slightly darker, head beautiful, beautiful expression on this dog, nice top line, good croup.

3rd CH DALHEATH CASTAWAY – P & G Revell

A nice head, eye a little bit round, nice stop, good skull, not enough neck for me and the lay of the shoulders not quite correct, top line good, would like more angulation in front and hindquarters.

4th DANCINVALE DATE TO B DARK – K Galbraith

My fourth place dog, a boy who enjoyed his day out, nice head, short in neck, top line rolling slightly (due to enjoying his dinners I think).

OPEN DOG CLASS (6 entries)

A very nice class to judge, some differences in type in here, but still very nice dogs.

1st GR CH GREMARIC CRUZIN – G Richens BEST OPPOSITE OPEN IN SHOW

Would prefer a slightly more masculine head, but head is beautiful, expression is lovely, would like a darker eye, lovely shoulders, very good expression, lovely lay of shoulder, good coming and going, good top line, good rear, very well muscled and nice set of tail.

2nd CH NAHROF MORE THAN WORDS – L Somers/E Badior

Again a beautiful dog, no 1 does have a slightly better lay of shoulder and slightly more reach of neck, love this dog's expression, again a very difficult choice between both dogs, lovely top line, beautiful condition, nice hocks, a very balanced dog.

3rd BALLYANN BEBACKBYMIDNITE – P & T Buckley

A slightly taller dog, would prefer a darker eye, very keen expression of the type that a border collie should have, slightly naughty today, good top line, raised his tail a little bit on the move, the set of the tail is slightly high.

4th CH TAMBOVALE KING OF THE ROAD ET – Harrison & Browning

A larger stronger dog, strong muzzle, strong head, would have preferred a more oval eye rather than the round eye, nice lay of shoulder, a little bit long in loin, nice top line,

BABY PUPPY BITCH CLASS (4 entries)

1st NAHROF GAME ON - L Somers/E Badior BEST BABY PUPPY IN SHOW

A dog that is very serious, lovely outline, beautiful expression and head, she has definitely been here before, lovely reach of neck, nice shoulders and good turn of stifle a lovely promising baby.

2nd KELLAGEM KIST BY A STAR – W & M Morgan

Another nice promising baby, nice shoulders, nice head, muzzle a little bit longer than the first place getter, still a very nice baby who has very nice movement. Well done.

3rd FEARMA DREAMER OF DREAMS- R Harris/D Herbert

The third place today was just a little bit worried, but she will gain some experience from today.

MINOR PUPPY BITCH CLASS (2 entries)

Both of them in the growing stages, a little bit naughty on the move but still two very nice young girls.

1st GREMARIC TALK SOON - G Richens BEST MINOR PUPPY IN SHOW

Nice bitch, nice dark eye, lovely head and expression, shoulders very nice, lovely top line at this stage, nice turn of stifle, good baby very promising.

2nd BENSHIVA BIG GIRLS DONT CRY – M Dean/B Farrell/Jordinson

Lovely head and expression on is bitch, nice shoulders, she's just going through the growing stages where her hindquarters are a little higher than the wither, but prefer the length of body on this one, however bounced around on the move,



PUPPY BITCH CLASS (3 entries)

A very nice class, nice to see three on the move that I really liked, they moved really well, a little but sloppy on up and back on a couple of them but that's an age thing but still three very nice bitches.

1st DANARI DESTINY HAS ARRIVED – P & T Wheatley BEST PUPPY IN SHOW The first place has a beautiful expression, and the eye slightly darker, lovely reach of neck, good

head, lovely top line, really nice shoulders, lovely level top line, nice croup, very nice quality bitch

2nd DALHEATH A FLASH IN TIME – A Cowin/M Rockey

A very nice bitch, liked her on the move, would prefer a higher ear set (but they don't move on their ears), but I really liked her shoulders and I liked her on the move very much.

3rd DALHEATH TIME TO DASH – M Rockey

Again another nice bitch, head not quite what I would like, muzzle is a bit longer, little bit fine through on the skull, but we still have a baby here, still a nice reach of neck, nice top line and lovely on the stand.

JUNIOR BITCH CLASS (3 entries)

Sorry again a technical fault, hence no critiques.

1st TULLAVIEW TAKE IT TO HEART (AI) – C & P Smith BEST OPPOSITE JUNIOR IN SHOW

2nd DREAMWOOD TOIREASA – D Schmelitschek

INTERMEDIATE BITCH CLASS (11 entries)

A very nice class to judge some quality bitches there making my decision very difficult, which is a really nice way to have to judge some very quality bitches on the places.

1st DANARI DUSKY ROSE – P & T Wheatley <u>BEST OPPOSITE INTERMEDIATE IN SHOW</u> A beautiful bitch, I would prefer a slightly darker eye, nice muzzle, good head, lovely breed type, lovely top line, very sound coming and going and lovely side gait good reach and drive.

2nd DANARI DANGER MONEY – W & M Morgan

Again a very nice bitch, again I would like a slightly darker eye, very nice on the move, lovely shoulders, nice top line, nice hindquarter, again a very nice bitch.

3rd GLENTRESS HWY TO HEAVEN - D & K Adams

One who was being a little bit naughty today, nice length of neck, good shoulders, would like a slightly darker eye again but a very nice type of bitch, lovely hindquarter.



2010: The year that was...

So it is that another year has been 'run and won' for the Australian dog show calendar, and as is to be expected 2010 saw the Border Collie proudly represented in all states of Australia! We are privileged as a

breed to have many outstanding representatives amongst our ranks that continue to take top honours at all levels. In recognition of those Border Collies who have done so well, we take a moment in this issue of *Bordertales* to make special mention of the final placings in the 2010 DogzOnline Point Score and to offer our congratulations on behalf of the Border Collie fraternity to the successful entrants of this competition.

To begin with the National Breed (All Breeds) competition, it is heartening to see a great many Border Collies achieving consistently in the Group and All Breeds ring! There were 47 Borders entered in the 2010 competition, spread out over 45 placings; a small increase on 2009. To qualify each of these dogs had to be awarded a Best In Group, Runner Up Best In Group, Best In Show or Runner Up Best In Show (All Breeds) award during 2010, and points were allocated to each entrant based on the number of exhibits entered according to their respective win. After a busy year, the top three national placings came down to two Victorian and one Queensland entrants in a very close race to the end of the year. Big congratulations to the eventual winner of the 2010 National Breed (All Breeds) competition, who lead the pack from the front for a good portion of the year, Ch Borderfame King Ohearts (Khayoz & Borderfame Kennels). 'Fletcher' notched up an exciting record of Best and Runner Up In Show, Best In Group and Runner Up Best In Group awards to finish the year the No.6 Working Dog in Victoria for 2010. It

was a close the minor placings, and in the end it was the Queensland exhibit **Ch Gremaric Speechless** (Richens) who finished in overall second place, followed by the winner of this same section 2009 **Gr Ch Innisman All Said N Done** (Hall & Sullivan). NSW's highest placing entrant was the fifth place winner **Gr Ch Nahrof Enough Said** (Hannigan, Somers & Badior). Like 2009 it was a tough competition, and congratulations to all those (entered or not in the DOL competition) who have won a major Group or In Show win in 2010 for showing the Border Collie at its best!

In the National Best Of Breed competition, which recognises wins at a breed level, again we had almost 100 breed entrants in the 2010 point score, eventually spread out over 82 placings. Points in this section were allocated according to Best or Runner Up Best of Breed wins throughout the year, with points tallying the number of dogs beaten at a breed level. And as previous years have shown us, the Best of Breed point score is a hotly contested prize, and 2010 proved to be no different. Congratulations to the eventual 2010 Best of Breed Winner, who was also the All Breeds winner, Ch Borderfame King Ohearts (Khayoz & Borderfame Kennels) from Victoria. 'Fletcher's' wins included Best of Breed at Melbourne Royal and at the prestigious Working Dog Club of Victoria Champ Show. Making it a repeat performance from 2009 was the 2010 second place winner Ch Bordalace Flash N Dash (Cowin) representing NSW, followed by his NSW compatriot Ch Syrvne Altair O Aquilae (Fossey) in third place. Giving the boys a run for their money in 2010 was the fourth place winner, and the highest placed female in the competition, Gr Ch Tehya Destiny All Over (Bailey). Indeed fouth, fifth and sixth place in the Best of Breed competition were all taken out by girls, and many more filled the

middle order – watch out boys they're hot on your heels!!



The **Rising Star (Breed)** competition is certainly the most popular on the DogzOnline system, and is a great way to celebrate the achievements of the future of our breed. In this competition fixed points are allocated on a sliding scale for dogs in the Baby, Minor, Puppy and Junior classes, with maximum points being awarded for a Class In Show win, and less for a for a Class In Group or Class of Breed win. Double points were also awarded this year for shows exceeding 750 exhibits. Again there were a great many Border Collie entrants in the 2010 competition. Congratulations to the eventual winner of the Rising Star (Breed) competition, keeping the title in NSW for another year, **Yarrancoly Playin With Fire** (Baldwin) who

won the competition with a consistent record of Class In Group and Class In Show awards throughout the year. 'Blaze' also went on to represent our breed in the Group and All Breeds sections, finishing the year as the No.9 NSW Rising Star in the Working Dog Group. In second place was the well-performed Kennoway Zip Up Yor Kilt (Kennoway & Moystonhill Kennels), who was also Victoria's No.9 Working Dog Rising Star. This year it was a tie for third place in 2010, with Ch Tehya Twilights Fire (Watling) of Tasmania and Clanheath Twist of Fate (Marshall) of the ACT completing the year on equal points. Congratulations to all the youngsters, many of whom also competed well on the Best of Breed and All Breeds point scores in 2010 to give the adults a run for their money!

Last but certainly not least is the 'ADVANCE' Breeder of

the Year Competition. This competition recognises the achievement of Australian Breeders at a breed, Group and All Breed's level based on titles and awards achieved during the year. The Border Collie competition had 17 entrants in total for 2010. Well done to the eventual winner of the Border Collie Breeder of the Year, Greg Richens of Gremaric Kennels! The Gremaric team sealed the deal for 2010 by obtaining several Australian Championship titles, and a great array of In Group and In Show wins with the six homebred dogs contributing to their score. In second place was Tehya Kennels (Bailey) who also celebrated a successful year in 2010. Merrinda Kennels (Allshorn) were the proud recipients of overall third place. NSW's top entrant was the fourth place winner, Yarrancoly Kennels (Baldwin) from western NSW. Well done to all!

Congratulations again to all the winners. Of course competitions such as this are open on a voluntary basis, and inevitably not every dog, exhibitor or breeder is represented in these contests. The 2011 show calendar looks to be another exciting one. And I'm certain we're in for another great year for our Border Collies – and who knows, with any luck as a fraternity we may be able celebrate a Border Collie as top Working Dog or All Breeds for 2011 – what a great achievement that would be! Of course, regardless of ribbons or titles, at the end of the day we each take home best Border Collies in the world! Good luck to everyone for 2011 – go forth and prosper!
