## **CEA and Colobomas**

**6/8/08**

There is a fairly common question that we are asked regarding the significance of CEA testing, in particular as it relates to the occurrence of colobomas. I have discussed this topic with Dr. Greg Acland, professor of medical genetics at Cornell University, whose research on CEA lead to the mutation's discovery. I've paraphrased that discussion below. I hope this helps to inform you or your breed club on the value of CEA testing. If I can be of further assistance, please feel free to contact me. I would also like to add that we would be interested in obtaining DNA or blood from any dogs that are diagnosed with colobomas. These samples will help to advance the research and our understanding of the somewhat complex interaction of CEA and the colobomas gene(s).

Colobomas occur in dogs' eyes for many reasons, and the same is true in human ophthalmology. In fact, if you search the ACVO/CERF Ocular Disorders DVD for coloboma (also try choroidal hypoplasia), you will see that many breeds are listed as having a low incidence of colobomas (also for choroidal hypoplasia) but are not generally recognized as segregating with collie eye anomaly. We have been puzzling over this for some time, and we are trying to accumulate DNA samples, Case Reports and pedigrees from as many such dogs as possible.

We have found that in at least 2 breeds (Soft-coated Wheaten Terriers, Berger de Pyrenees) that there is a clearly hereditary disorder that in many respects resembles collie eye, including the occurrence of colobomas, but is definitely not caused by the same gene involved in CEA. We are continuing to work on these dogs, and are actively seeking information on as many such dogs as possible. As part of the collie eye anomaly syndrome, it has been our experience in the pedigrees that we have been able to study intensely, that colobomas only occur in eyes that are homozygous for the CEA mutation (as determined by the Optigen CEA DNA test). We know that these colobomas are not caused by the CEA mutation alone, and to the best of our knowledge, they appear to require the presence of a second mutation as well as the CEA mutation, both in the homozygous state. We have not so far identified the second gene and mutation, but are working towards it. All that said however, the purpose of the Optigen CEA test is to allow breeders to carefully and gradually remove the CEA mutation from their breeding stock. This function is not diminished, i.e. is still worthwhile, even if there is a second cause for colobomas in the breed.

# Obedience Point Score

## Purpose of Competition

To encourage the handlers and dogs to achieve a consistent high standard in the obedience area, and be rewarded with recognition for their time and efforts

## Format of Competition

Each class has its own point score, i.e. Novice, Open and Utility. Handlers are required to submit the following;

1. Qualifying scores (total of three) for the desired class
2. The qualifying scores must be achieved by the handler working his own dog.
3. The 3 scores must be achieved by the same dog.
4. Only 1 score card may be submitted under a particular judge. In the event of multiple exhibits owned/worked by the same handler each dog is required in their total of 3 scores to have achieved these under 3 different judges.
5. Competitors must be financial members of the BCC of NSW Inc prior to the date of the earliest calendar dated qualifying score submitted, and must remain financial members of the BCC of NSW Inc during the running of the competition.
6. The twelve month qualifying period will commence from 1 September 2007 and cease on 31 August 2008.
7. In the event of a tied point score, the exhibitors will be asked to submit a further qualifying card until a winner is determined.
9. Photocopies of the qualifying cards must be sent to the **Secretary, Border Collie Club of NSW by 14 September 2008.**
10. A summary of the aggregates for each class will be published in the next available Bordertales and awards made as soon as possible.
11. The decision of the Committee is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
12. Failure of the competitor to fulfil all the criteria listed above will render their entry null and void.
13. This competition does not require an entry fee.

The 2007/2008 competition is now underway with the qualifying period being 1 September 2007 to 31 August 2008. Competition rules will be published at frequent intervals in Bordertales.

Baby Dog Class		
1 <sup>st</sup>	<b>Etherial Up In Lights</b>	Lovely baby dog, beautiful head, lovely reach of neck broadening to his shoulders, good shoulder angulation. Very nice baby who is showing a lot of potential.
2 <sup>nd</sup>	<b>Classicyds Coolahbahtree (AI)</b>	The baby of the class who is only 3 months of age, head a bit fine for me, felt his shoulders were quite good and got around the ring nicely.
3 <sup>rd</sup>	<b>Waminda Dusty Trails</b>	Beautiful headed little dog, lovely top line, nice chest, shoulder angulation not as good as the first two.
4 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Claremist Shooting Star</b>	A lovely little baby, again shoulder angulation a little straight, lovely head, but not quite up there with the other placegetters on the day.
Minor Puppy Dog Class		
1 <sup>st</sup>	<b>Totachi Wave Breaker</b>	This youngster has quite a nice head, good chest, a big flowing coat at the moment, which throws you off a bit when he's moving but he does have a good topline. He has a lovely reach of neck. Front just a little out at the moment but at 8 ½ months a fair bit of growth to happen, quite a nice dog.
2 <sup>nd</sup>	<b>Abizac Never Say Never</b>	Apparently had a fright at the royal, backed off a little but allowed me to go over him, a little finer in the head than the first one and a little short in the upper arm.
Puppy Dog Class		
1 <sup>st</sup>	<b>Bordalace Flash N Dash</b>	Very nice exhibit, loved his head. Just needs to mature up. I think you will have a lot of fun with him down the track when he matures, great head, shoulders, top line, in nice coat at the moment, really liked him.
2 <sup>nd</sup>	<b>Dykinta Networking</b>	Another nice specimen, not quite the same strength of head as the first one, lovely topline, again a beautiful neck, broadening to the shoulders, shoulder angulation

		not quite as good as the first placing, lovely well let down hocks.
3 <sup>rd</sup>	<b>Maghera Against All Odds</b>	A rangier dog, a little out in the front at the moment, again the shoulder angulation is not as good as the 1 <sup>st</sup> placing . Moved around the ring quite well.
4 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Trucharm On the Run</b>	Lovely boy, looked a picture on the stack, lovely rear end, I liked his head better than my 2 <sup>nd</sup> and 3 <sup>rd</sup> placings but his shoulder angulation is straight and letting him down, so he isn't moving out like he should be.
<b>Junior Dog Class</b>		
1 <sup>st</sup>	<b>Etherial Heartbreaker</b>	Quite a nice specimen of the breed, good chest, nice straight front, pleasant head, neck is of good length, good topline, just dropping off a little over the croup, nice turn of stifle, straight & parallel in behind.
2 <sup>nd</sup>	<b>Danari Destined to Thrill</b>	Again a nice specimen of the breed, chest isn't quite as developed as the first one, a little out in front at the moment but a lovely picture on the stack, lovely head, nice neck, good angulation of shoulders.
3 <sup>rd</sup>	<b>Nahrof Tangled Web</b>	I found this youngster a little shorter in body length than the first two. Beautiful head, good strong neck, a very close class, some nice dogs and the decisions were quite close.
4 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Ballyann Bebackbymidnite</b>	Another nice dog, a little different to the first three in style and type, nice straight top line, correct length of body, felt he is just a little slower in developing and I feel that down the track he will be a contender but today he was the fourth place getter
<b>Intermediate Dog</b>		
1 <sup>st</sup>	<b>Danari Dramatic Sequel</b>	A darker dog with a very pleasant head, good front, well coated with good strong topline. Moderate length of body with a good turn of stifle. Presented and shown beautifully, good ground covering gait.
2 <sup>nd</sup>	<b>Bordalace Eye Spy</b>	So tight between 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> , really liked this boy, beautiful head, lovely topline, again could get around the ring, a lovely specimen of the breed.
3 <sup>rd</sup>	<b>Syryne Altair O Aquilae HIC</b>	Liked this boy a lot, his topline threw me a bit, when he stands stacked it appears to be straight however when he was relaxed he tended to be a little soft. When he moves he doesn't show it, lovely dog who has a lot of wonderful qualities and was presented beautifully.
4 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Ch Yarrancoly The Real Deal (AI)</b>	Again a lovely dog, with a beautiful head, strong chest, lovely bone, moved quite well.
5 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Finealta Son of a Wizard</b>	A lovely type with a pleasant head and other good qualities just found that on the day the higher place getters moved around the ring with more ease.

<b>Australian Bred Dog</b>		
1 <sup>st</sup>	<b>Ch Danari Danceth Waves</b>	Lovely dog who got around the ring effortlessly, good head proportions, strong neck, well angled shoulders, good straight topline, nice turn of stifle. Straight and parallel front and rear, good depth to his body.
2 <sup>nd</sup>	<b>Dalheath Signature</b>	A nice headed dog who could get around the ring effortlessly, has nice shoulder angulation, the forelegs are straight and parallel when viewed from the front and topline straight, good length of body. Handled beautifully.
3 <sup>rd</sup>	<b>Gr Ch Benshiva Dot Com</b>	Beautiful boy who unfortunately was just a little too out of coat on the day. A beautiful head and a lovely style of a dog who moved well. A picture on the stack, just missing his furnishings on the day and against some tough competition. Presented and shown to perfection.
4 <sup>th</sup>	<b>Gr Ch Korella Strike a Light</b>	Nice style of dog, lovely head proportions, very honest boy who had a little bit too much weight on him today, which made him work very hard getting around the ring. Again, beautifully presented and shown.
<b>Open Dog Class</b>		
1 <sup>st</sup>	<b>Ch Etherial Chase the Ace PT</b>	A lovely balanced and moderately boned dog, Good head proportions with a nice soft eye. Moderate in all areas when you look at him from the tip of his nose to the end of his tail, moved around the ring very nicely and shown very well. Good ground covering gait.
